

Columbarium

The special place that is becoming the modern churchyard cemetery is a columbarium. It is an above ground durable structure designed to contain niches of cremated human remains (cremains). The columbarium is a place of solitude located on the west side of our Sanctuary.



Memorial Garden

The King of Kings Memorial Garden is expanding to include brick pavers that can be engraved with name, year of birth and year of death in memory of a loved one. The project is self-funded. The cost of each engraved paver is \$100, which is tax-deductible.

Urns & Inscriptions

Sheet Bronze Urns

There are endless options for cremation urns. While our columbarium may accommodate other urn styles, we recommend the sheet bronze urn because it



addresses space, economic, and management concerns. Two of these urns, which are $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 each, will fit into our niches.



Inscriptions

Names and dates are inscribed into the marble fronts. For clarity, letters on the inscription are highlighted with a painted color in the depth of the engraving to provide beautiful, long lasting readability.
