





Centered on God, our mission is to feed physical hunger, spiritual hunger, and our hunger to be in community.

## Why Summer Camps?

### Summer Camps Create Something Truly Special

Our camps give students a chance to learn about God in a variety of environments; surrounded by peers and adult mentors who encourage and walk alongside them. It's here that lasting memories are made, new friendships are formed, and the next generation of student leaders are equipped. It's why we continue to pour into these meaningful moments every summer.

### Friends Are Welcome!

From Pre-K through graduating seniors, our summer camps offer fun, faith-filled experiences for every age. Camps help children and families stay connected with our church throughout the summer while also welcoming the wider community. Inviting friends reflects our commitment to creating a place where everyone feels welcomed, valued, and connected. For those that may not have a church home, our camps offer an introduction to community and spiritual growth.

### Student Leader Opportunities

Equipping our student leaders and serves as an example for our younger students and is a key part of their own faith development. Students who want to volunteer submit a leadership form, interview with our Kids of the Kingdom Coordinator and attend training sessions.

## Financial Support and Fundraising

Costs for camps are managed closely to keep them affordable. Participation in fundraising is encouraged to help defray the cost of Camp Wapo or the senior high trip.

## Camp Wapo

Camp Wapo has been a partner for 17 years! Kids love sleeping in bunk beds, playing large group games with 100 of their newest friends, worshiping at the lake, Bible study and lots of awesome free time activities. 10 churches attend camp the same week we do, and our staff joins our students, building relationships while playing games and sharing meals. When we ask our high school graduates for a favorite memory of growing up at King of Kings, many say "Camp Wapo!"

### Seeds Camp

July 17-19, 2026 (Completed 1st - 3rd Grade)

This action-packed weekend for our youngest campers begins with Friday registration at 3:00 p.m. and concludes with worship at 12:00 noon on Sunday. Knowing that this may be a child's first camp experience or even their first time away from home, our counselors will spend every moment with these campers. Kids will stay in a cabin with their friends and other kids their own age. Each day campers will experience chapel, campfire, Bible study, cabin activities and other fun games.

### Wapo Youth Camp

July 19-24, 2026 (Completed 4th - 8th Grade)

Come for a week filled with fun and faith activities that will impact our kids' lives. Each day, kids will worship, be in God's Word, participate in cabin activities, enjoy free time and play games. It is an amazing and powerful week.

### Roots at Ox Lake Senior High Youth Camp

July 19-24 (Completed 9th- 12th Grade)

Designed for high schoolers, this camp is filled with camp favorites, plus a little more freedom and conversation to dig deeper in faith and grow in relationship with peers. The big kids love their week at Ox Lake, a part of Wapo that is much smaller and more rustic.

### Vacation Bible School

June 22-26, 2026 (Ages 3-4th Grade)

This summer we will be on a journey to Rainforest Falls VBS! Kids will step into a vibrant rainforest - full of color, sound, and surprises where each moment draws them deeper into discovering who God is. From wild games, sciency-wow experiments and Bible stories that spark curiosity, kids will explore God's nature revealed in fresh, unforgettable ways.

There are many spots for student leaders and adults to step into, including leading a learning station, being a crew leader, or decorating and organizing.

### American Girls Camp

July 13-17, 2026 (1st-5th Grade)
